Guest Speakers: Norm Carver, Architect, Author, Photographer

Topic: Norm Carver Homes in Kalamazoo and Around the World

- Norm lived in Kalamazoo a good portion of his life, and much of it was spent living in the Winchell Neighborhood, including living on Waite and on Parkview in his youth.
- He used to ride his horse to school from his childhood home on Parkview, there was a stable at what is now Kalamazoo Christian where you would leave your horse for the day while you attended school up the hill on Winchell.
- As a teen, Norm worked for Architect Bill Stone.
- Norm then went to Yale Architectural School, where he saw many new types of buildings during his first year.
- The Army then sent Norm to Japan, where he saw yet more architecture.
- Norm produced 2 books on Japanese Architecture, then went on to publish 5 more books on architecture from around the world. See Norm's website for a sampling of photography plus the names of the books are listed at the top of the page (*Secretary's Note: I found this, Norm did not "advertise" it, but did mention that he has a gallery downtown*): <http://www.normancarver.com/>
- Norm designed about 150 houses, presentation included a slide show:
 - In Kalamazoo, Norm designed houses in Winchell neighborhood, on Memory Lane, in Oshtemo, on Gull Lake and in Comstock.
 - In Winchell, this includes houses in Parkwyn, on Frederick, on Sheffield, on Aberdeen and on Rambling.
 - Many houses along the Lake Michigan shore
 - Oakland, near Detroit

- Ohio
- California
- On the East Coast
- Florida
- Japan (a Tennis Stadium and a house)
- Seoul (including the old US Embassy)
- Never used “Interior Desecrators”, but did design homes that people could bring their stuff into, and there would be places for their stuff without their stuff taking over the house. It would still look well designed.
